PLANNING AID SCOTLAND

Graduate Training Scheme

Planning Aid Scotland have been developing a Training Scheme which will take recent Graduates through some of the main areas of planning, and have interactive sessions on some of the core things planners are likely to come across in their jobs. The information in these sessions is quite Local Authority focused, as most of our volunteers work in Local Authority roles.

PART 1 – Currently completed but will potentially be run again.

6 people currently working in planning will explain their roles over 3 sessions, with plenty of time for you to ask them questions. These sessions will all be online, and will be recorded for anyone who is unable to attend. The aim of these sessions is to help recent graduates understand what the different planning jobs are, how they fit together, and which they might be interested in pursuing.

PART 2

This part will be three interactive sessions, taking you through some aspects of Permitted Development, Validation of Planning Applications, and Reports of Handling. These sessions will be a mixture of information delivery and a chance to put things into practice. For example, based on the information given, do you think that a mock application would come under Permitted Development or not? We are hoping that this will help you learn what to look for, and how to go through the process of assessing these things.


